Gender, journalism and social media Oslo Metropolitan University Spring 2018

I was really glad, and also a bit surprised, when I heard about the expressmobilitet. I am currently studying my first year of journalism and media MA studies in Finland and for some reason or another, heard about the expressmobilitet for the first time in the last Autumn. However, when I came across with the courses OsloMet (known as HØgskolen i Oslo og Akerhus before) and found the course "Gender, journalism and social media", I started immediately to find out how it could be possible to take part to the course.

First about the pre-arrangements. I contacted directly to the OsloMet's addressed contact person who answered for me very quickly. It was the same with the coordinator who I was contacted with the Nordplus organisation. It was also easy to arrive in Oslo and also to the university.
